Joint statement: supporting the renewal of the SME Intergroup in the European Parliament

Dear Members of the European Parliament,

As discussions on the renewal of Parliamentary Intergroups take place, we would like to **ask for your support on renewing the mandate of the SME Intergroup.**

Intergroups play a unique and essential role in the European Parliament by providing forums for informal exchange of views on key issues across different political groups. These forums facilitate important contact between Members and civil society.

Despite the significant contribution SMEs make to Europe's economy, there is no dedicated committee within the European Parliament.
